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ABSTRACT

INTRODUCTION

When we finally comprehend its real power and beauty, we will understand that in not only spiritual but also practical matters, it holds great value.

We also need to consciously separate science and pseudoscience, which promotes fallacy. It provides false but easy to understand and follow answers, and it spreads herd mentality.

Sagan is of the opinion, that science isn't in complete contrast with the concepts of spirituality. He is of a similar opinion of Richard Dawkins, who calls the phenomenon of science being able to produce acute spiritual experience.

Science also brings out a sense of admiration and wonder for the feats of nature. Understanding at it's most basic level is connecting, blending, even if at a very small scale, with the splendor of the Cosmos. With the expanding database of science, it has transformed into something which pans nations and generations.

WHAT IS SPIRITUALITY?

Spirituality, unlike other material objects, is not something that can be weighed, or calculated, neither can it be proved. It is instead made up of ideals, ethics, fantasy, and credence. Despite all the secrecy that shrouds it, spirituality holds immense importance to our well-being. Spirituality is what forms the base for our morals, ethics, and values. Spirituality is what brings meaning to our lives, as by developing it we come closer to discovering ourselves, our wisdom and feelings of love are positively affected. During the writing of his bibliography's introduction, Gandhi said, "But I should certainly like to narrate my experiments in the spiritual field which are known only to myself and from which I have derived such power as I possess for working in the political field. If the experiments are spiritual then there can be no room for self-praise. The very purpose of life is self-realization and to see God face to face, to attain Moksha."

All of Gandhi's ventures, aim to get him closer to this goal. He has also taught morals that hope to make attaining happiness lesser about materialistic assets.

A man who practices spirituality immensely is capable of connecting with millions of people around the world who may have never even seen him. On the other hand, an exquisite speaker with no spirituality will fail to make such a connection with his/her audience. This experience is unlike others, we cannot derive it through our usual senses. According to Napoleon, there are two powers in this world, the sword, and the spirit. And in the long run, the spirit emerges victorious.
